Daazo - the European Shortfilm Centre proudly presents the 3rd edition of the Friss Hús International Shortfilm Festival, which will take place at the end of March 2015 in Budapest, Hungary. The success of the last two years made it possible for Friss Hús to become one of the most important shortfilm events in Hungary.

The long term plan of the organisers of Friss Hús is to make sure that the event becomes an internationally acclaimed festival where the audience can watch entertaining and colourful short film selections and where the filmmakers can meet important professionals from the film industry as well as attend special workshops. The best film will be awarded with a cash prize of €1,000 (as well as 100,000 HUF for the National Competition and Best Hungarian Animation respectively). Several other valuable prizes will be given out too. (To be announced later.)

Submission deadlines:

Early: November 30th, 2014

Late: December 31st, 2014

Competitive Categories:

Hungarian Live-action

Hungarian Animation

International Competition

Eligible short films are:

- Max. 30 minutes length
- Any countries
- Any genres (Live action/Documentary/Animation)
- Completed after January 2013

Please notice that at the festival the films will be screened in widescreen the submitter has to have an adequate screening copy of the film.

We prefer h264 .mov files or Apple Pro Res, but you can send us DVD (PAL) or DCP too, although the festival couldn't undertake the shipping cost of the screening copy.

The sound has to be at least Stereo or better.

Early bird entry fee: €15 (until November 30, 2014)

Late deadline entry fee: €25 (until December 31, 2014)

The programme of the festival will be announced at the beginning of March.
